
#### Louisiana Engineering Society A.B. Paterson Medal for an Engineer in Management

On January 31, 2018, our president, Kenneth H. Nelson, received the A.B. Paterson Medal for an Engineer



in Management from the Louisiana Engineering Society. It was presented at the Joint Engineering Societies Conference in Lafayette, Louisiana. The Medal is awarded as conditions warrant, but not more often than annually, for distinguished service in management by an engineer. Achievement in management rather than engineering or scientific attainments are the primary criterion for the selection of the recipient. The desire of the society is not only to recognize the recipient, but to encourage and inspire other engineers to take a greater role in the field of business management. 
## A. Pierre "Pete" Olivier, P.E. Retires


